The centerpiece of the blissful Balboa Park, the San Diego Zoo, is a prolific destination for adults and children alike. The zoo is over 98.84 acres of diverse landscapes and is home to an excess of 3,500 fauna that belongs to 650 species or subspecies. The San Diego Zoo, established in 1916, is one of the few non-profit wildlife conservation zones to nurture the highly-endangered Giant Panda. Laden with man-made habitats that emulate various topographies from around the globe, the park's most-visited exhibits include the Monkey Trails, the Polar Bear Plunge, Elephant Odyssey, Tiger River, Koalaformia and the Panda Trek.
